PLAYING IT SAFE ON HALLOWEEN

Halloween may be a fun holiday for kids, but following a few safety tips will ensure that Halloween night will also be a safe time for all.

"Unhaunting" Your House

- Welcome trick-or-treaters at home by turning on your outside lights.
- Remove objects from your yard that might present a hazard.

- Drive slowly all night. You never know what might suddenly cross your path.
- Report any suspicious or criminal activity to police.

Preparing Your Kids

- Make sure older kids go out with friends. Younger kids should go with an adult.
- Remind them not to take short

cuts through alleys, backyards, or fields.

- Remind kids not to enter strange homes or cars.
- Have them carry a flashlight that works.

Eating the Treats

 Tell kids not to eat anything until it has been checked by an adult.

TRASH PICKUP

Trash pickup is on Tuesdays and Fridays. Trash should be placed out no earlier than 4:30 pm on Mondays and Thursdays.

Recycling is also collected on Tuesdays and may also be put out Mondays no earlier than 4:30 pm.



ASSESSMENT FEES

Annual assessment fees are \$446 and are payable quarterly at \$111.50. Payment due dates are Jan 1, Apr 1, Jul 1, and Oct 1. Payments are considered late if not received by the 30th of the month due.

Past due balances are subject to a late fee of \$25.00 and interest of 6% APR, both applied quarterly.

PARKING & TOWING

Any vehicle parked in a lot without a hang tag will be subject to towing. If you are delinquent on your assessment fees, your parking privileges will be suspended until any amount owed is paid in full.
